



SCD is non-regulatory and all services are free




 Outreach continues to expand regionally and statewide via Better Ground.


















- Livingston Bay important habitat for juvenile salmon*

- Community strife






March 2016 storm damage













- Our concerns

 - Reaching wider community










Grant Project:


- Design/Build: Anchored large logs per Jim Johannessen's recommendation.

- Landowner highlights






Survey workshop/tour participants and Livingston Bay community residents to determine effectiveness of demonstrations and online resources.






Benefits to Port Susan MSA
